

National Workshop on Comprehensive Glossary of Engineering Terminology under Ministry of Education held at Dibrugarh University

The Commission for Scientific and Technical Terminology (CSTT), under the Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India, New Delhi, organized a 6-day meeting cum workshop on a comprehensive glossary of engineering terminology, from August 17 to August 22, 2026 at Dibrugarh University. The CSTT is mandated to evolve scientific and technical terminology in Hindi and other Indian languages listed in the Eighth Schedule of the Indian Constitution. To fulfill the objectives of NEP 2020, the CSTT has initiated a project to prepare an engineering glossary in the Assamese language.

Prof. Hitesh Kumar Mishra, Chairman, CSTT, approved holding this meeting of national importance at Dibrugarh University under the coordinator ship of Dr. Dhrubajyoti Neog, Assistant Professor in the Department of Petroleum Technology, Dibrugarh University. The inaugural programme commenced with the Dibrugarh University anthem. Eight subject experts and four language experts participated in the 6-day meeting cum workshop. The inaugural session started with a welcome address by the meeting coordinator, Dr Dhrubajyoti Neog, followed by an inaugural speech by Dr Shahzad Ahmad Ansari, Assistant Director, CSTT, New Delhi.
